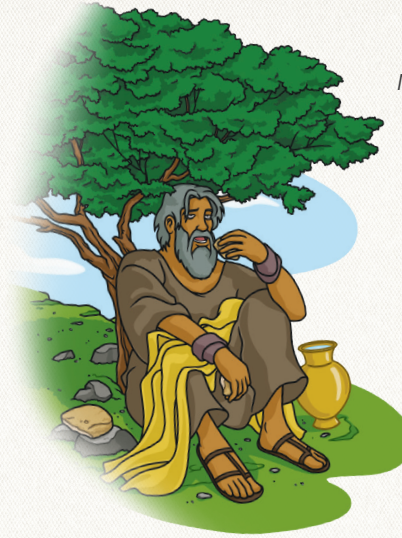

What You Heard *In the Word*

- Elijah fled from Jezebel, but God protected him and gave him food, drink, and encouragement when he needed it.
- King Ahab and Queen Jezebel committed many sins against God, and God destroyed them and their family as punishment.

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

Suppose you hear someone say, “I don’t think I’m responsible for my sin because I’m just a kid.” **What could you say?**

Sin fills every human heart and separates us from God. You’re aware of your sin and know that you do bad things, so it isn’t a good idea to ignore it just because you’re a kid. God must punish all sin. If you’re old enough to know you sin, you’re old enough to know about the cure for sin. God sent his Son, Jesus. He lived a perfect life and was the only one who could take the punishment we deserve because of our sin. Those who believe in Jesus and repent of their sins no longer need to worry about God’s punishment because they’ll be forgiven and promised a home in heaven with God.
